HOW IT STARTED

- Recommendations from Visiting Mum evaluation 2017
- Based on Lord Farmer's Report (2019): Importance of Strengthening Prisoners' Family Ties to Prevent Reoffending and Reduce Intergenerational Crime.
- The project seeks to develop and test a new model of support that directly implements a key recommendation in the Lord Farmer report -that all women's prisons should have an on-site social worker as part of a multi-disciplinary team.

AIMS

Together A Chance is a partnership between Sylvia Adams Charitable Trust and Pact piloting a new approach to improve the life chances of some of the most vulnerable children in our society. This three year project will work to create systemic change in the women's estate around the needs of children whose mothers are in custody.

A JOURNEY INTO PRISON

WHAT THIS LOOKS LIKE

Liaising with social services, court and other community services for advice and information

Support relationship building with children's social worker

Facilitating mother's attendance at meetings e.g. CIN, CP (physically or virtually)

Hosting professionals who want to visit

Supporting mother's contact with their children

Reaching out to family members and supporting communication/discussions

Supporting mothers in attending court

Supporting access to legal representation

Attend meetings in community on mother's behalf on a case by case basis

Explaining process and procedures to mothers to promote better understanding

Providing in-cell work books and groups aimed at parenting, relationships with children

Supporting parenting assessments

Providing emotional support to mothers in custody

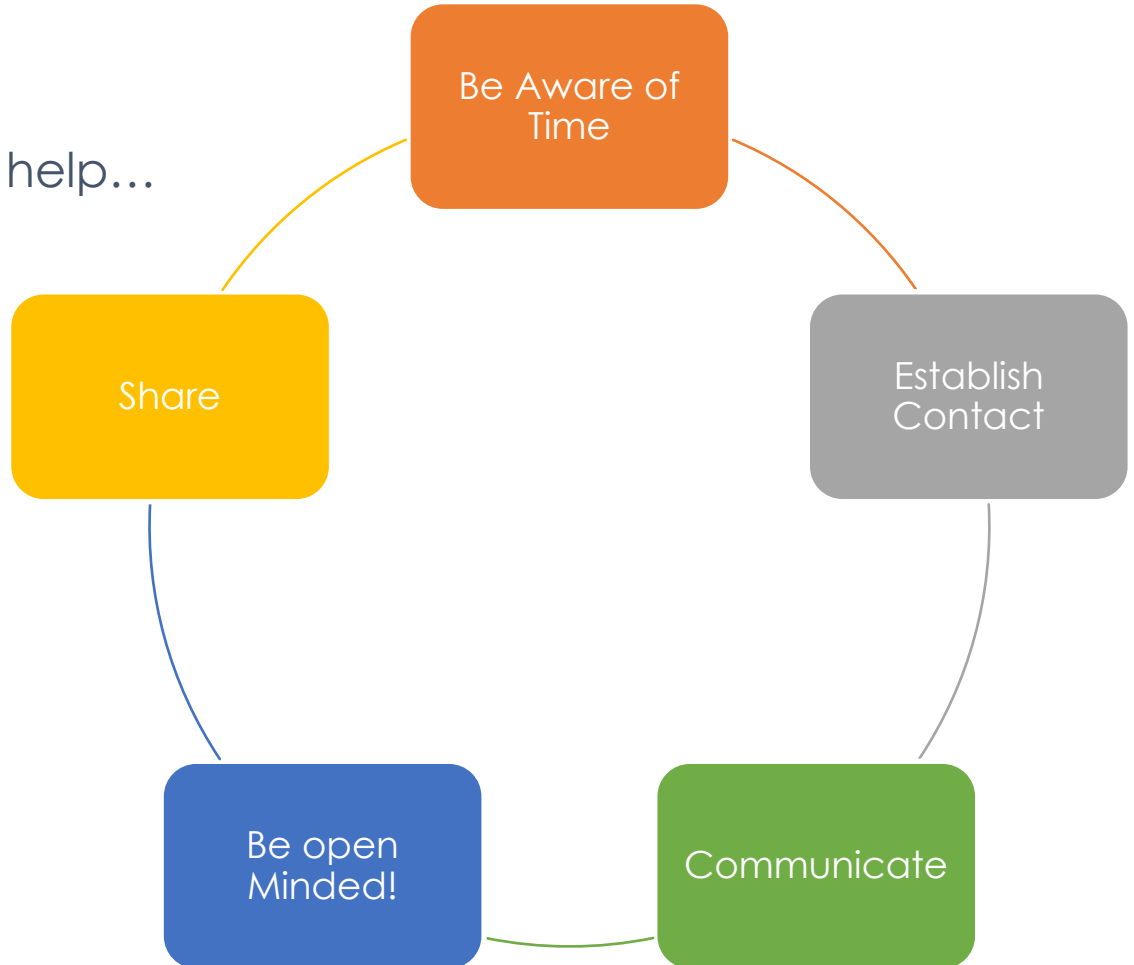

How can we tackle unconscious bias?

- Recognise that we all have unconscious biases!
- Self reflection and analysis, both independently and through supervision
- Avoid making rushed or "instinctive" decisions, think about how you can promote objective judgement in your work
- Listen to others, seek feedback and share good practice with your teams
